Culturally responsive pedagogy starts with the premise that race and class matter. Despite best efforts, some schools are unsuccessful in conveying to African American students that they belong. An educator's understanding of the huge economic, social and cultural contributions that African American history has made to our nation can significantly impact interactions with students. Educators need to understand there are different forms of content knowledge and pedagogies necessary to begin closing the gap. How does a leader give support to teachers if they don't know or understand it themselves?

It was only 150 years ago when the United States had slavery, and 50 years ago when our lives were segregated along racial lines. Do you understand the implications this timeline has on your students?

His published work includes *Kwanzaa: Black Power and the Making of the African American Holiday Tradition*, Routledge, 2009 and another book is in progress.
