#### **Campus Maps & Directions**



From the **East**: Take I-494 *West* Take France Avenue exit At end of exit ramp, turn left Proceed south to 98th Street, turn right at traffic light

From the **Southeast:** Take I-35W North Take exit 6 for 98th Street/County Hwy-1 At end of exit ramp, turn left Move to the right lane to stay on 98th Street Proceed west to the college at France Avenue







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
