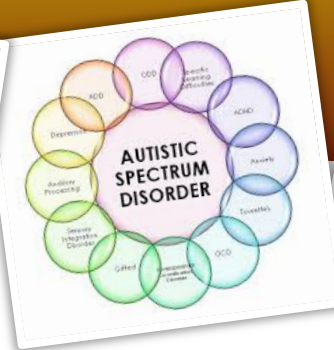


Free Workshop: Discoveries on the Spectrum: A Look at Autism Research

Amy Esler is an assistant professor in Pediatrics and leads the Autism Clinic at the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities. She completed her PhD in school psychology at the U and worked as a school psychologist in Minnesota before focusing her career on autism. Dr. Esler collaborates with autism researchers around the country on early diagnosis and the creation of diagnostic measures for children under age 3. She specializes in diagnosis and management of ASD in very young children and in older children with limited functional communication. Her current research focuses on autism prevalence and the interaction between culture, screening and diagnostic practices, and access to services.
