#### What is an Intervener?

An intervener is a **trained** professional staff member who works one-on-one with a child who is **deafblind** to provide critical connections to other people and the environment. The intervener opens channels of **communication** between the child and others, provides **access to information**, and **facilitates opportunities** for learning and development.

#### What is the importance of an Intervener?

Deafblindness creates very unique and complex challenges caused by the combined effect of both vision and hearing loss. These challenges are mainly in the area of communication, concept development and social and emotional development. An intervener responds to these challenges by serving as a bridge to the world for the child who is deafblind.
