#### Workshop description:

This session will provide resources and group discussion with which to build a repertoire of STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts, and Mathematics) and diversity sign vocabulary so that interpreters can provide a more equivalent message. The discussion will focus on how to make context visually accessible for Deaf/Hard of Hearing students in classroom settings. We will also discuss how our own experiences affect how we process information as interpreters. Working in the educational setting, interpreters will be encouraged to engage with their team to promote a positive and accessible environment.

### **Presenter: Keith Burisek**

After graduating from the interpreter training program at Northcentral Technical College, Wausau, WI in 2010, Keith began working for the Wisconsin School for the Deaf (WSD) as a teaching assistant. During his time at WSD, he was able to work as a summer counselor at a special needs camp for children, and travel to Gallaudet University, as well as to Paris, France with the first Deaf French Student Exchange pilot program in 2011. Keith also worked in Eau Claire, WI as an educational and freelance interpreter working in a variety of settings and completed his BA degree in 2014 through Siena Heights University. He recently joined Outreach-WESP-DHH in June of 2018 and is adjusting to life out of the Northwoods and wearing several different "hats" at Outreach from Consultant to EIPA proctor to co-facilitator of Wisconsin's Educational Interpreter Coaching program. Keith also works with the NAIE as a state ambassador for Wisconsin.
