Workshop/Course Description: This workshop is designed for mentors working with interpreters who are pursuing their national certification. With the evolving exam administration, and progress in the new exam productions, it is critical for mentors to stay up to date on these developments. Participants in this interactive workshop will have the opportunity to gain a basic understanding of the exam's structure and identify supplementary mentoring resources to apply to their mentoring sessions.

Note: This workshop will not discuss the test content. It will merely discuss the structure of the exams.
