

As a framework for organizing instruction and educational systems, The Culturally Responsive Educators Framework; Mindset & Skillset supports teachers in planning and fostering and implementing Equitable mindsets and skill sets for all students.

The Culturally Responsive Educators Framework is designed for K-12 teachers and leaders who want to maximize equity implementation for effective instructional delivery for culturally and linguistically diverse learners. Teachers will learn to shift mindset and skill sets to reach and support all learners. The Culturally Responsive Educators Framework is a framework for planning and delivering instruction in culturally responsive ways to ensure equitable access to educational systems and for student achievement.

- 5. Moving from Deficit to Asset Approaches
- 6. Becoming Equity Advocates and Equity Brokers
- 7. Achieving Cultural Competence

When implemented to a high degree, the Culturally Responsive Educators Framework is proven to:

- Increase student achievement
- Improve educator awareness of inequities in systems and classrooms
- Deliver results aligned to equitable best practices
- Prepare both students and teachers to become culturally and racially responsive
