Evidence-Based Considerations for School-Based Speech-Language Pathology: Reflect, Refuel, Re-Engage (Phuong Lien Palafox, M.S., CCC-SLP)

Description: The demands of school-based speech-language pathologists (SLPs) are unrelenting. Impacted by increased workload, lack of opportunity to collaborate with staff and families, increased compliance/productivity demands and decreased job satisfaction (ASHA Schools Survey, 2020), SLPs carry a heavy load. This session will address collective concerns and evidence-based considerations to maximize SLP bandwidth and impact within a school setting. The course will prioritize service delivery models, treatment interventions and considerations for SLP mental health. Through a lens of evidence-based data and human-centered practices, Phuong will walk you through a high-impact and meaningful session to align with your current days.
