OUR PRESENTER

Lillian Durán has a Ph.D. in Educational Psychology from the University of Minnesota and is currently an Associate Professor in the Department of Special Education and Clinical Sciences at the University of Oregon. She holds a B.A. in Elementary Education from Antioch College and a M.A. in Education and Human Development from the George Washington University. She is currently Associate Dean of Academic Affairs in the College of Education at the University of Orgon. Her research is focused on improving instructional and assessment practices with preschool-aged multilingual learners. She is currently a Co-Principal Investigator on two IES measurement grants to develop a Spanish preschool language and literacy general outcome measure designed for screening and progress monitoring. Dr. Durán frequently delivers presentations nationally focused on recommended practices in assessment and intervention with young children with and without identified disabilities who are multilingual learners. Dr. Durán also has experience with higher education curriculum development and she began a graduate Early Childhood Special Education licensure program at Minnesota State Mankato. Additionally, she has served on multiple equity and diversity councils including the National Association for Young Children and the Division for Early Childhood. Prior to Dr. Durán's work in higher education she worked for 9 years as an early childhood special education teacher both in Prince George's County, Maryland and in rural Minnesota.
