Workshop description: There is increasing importance being placed on the role of math signs in the high school classroom and the impact on learning and testing. Many educational interpreters and teachers have different signs for certain mathematical terminology, and it is possible that a lack of standardization may impact student learning. This workshop is in response for the overwhelming request from the August 15, 2022, presentation. Educational interpreters specifically have requested higher level and visual representations of math concepts with ASL signs. The presentation is designed to help you to become familiar with advanced mathematical terms and how to apply them in classroom settings.

Presenter: Paul Glaser has a Bachelor of Arts degree in mathematics and a Master of Science degree in deaf education, with a focus on math education. He has been a teacher for over 15 years. In addition, Paul has been a certified deaf interpreter (CDI) for the past 7 years and also holds a master mentor WERIC certification.
