Workshop description: Effective feedback is crucial for interpreters to continue reflecting on and improving their work. Many interpreters find that there are barriers to effective feedback, whether personal stressors, questions about navigating professional relationships, or a need for shared interpreting vocabulary. This workshop will provide interpreters and interpreter mentors tools to create an objective, non-judgmental, specific, and realistic assessment for yourself or others. This workshop gives tools to talk about interpreting work and guiding conversations about the cognitive process behind the scenes. Most of all, this workshop gives language that helps participants feel supported and able to stay in the conversation.

Presenter: Bridget Sabatke, MS, NIC-Master, EIPA 4.0, QMHI-S, has been an interpreter and interpreter educator in the Twin Cities since 2005. Bridget's work in K-12 educational interpreting inspired her interest in interpreter assessment strategies. Bridget currently teaches ASL/English interpreting at St. Catherine University where she has been in different capacities since 2010.
