In this engaging workshop, we will cover specific points to help related service providers transition from a caseload model to a workload model. We will identify how a caseload model differs from a workload model and why a caseload model is holding you and your school from achieving goals. Research related to occupational therapy and using a workload approach will be addressed to show how this model can work. After that, we will look at your specific caseload and how it may be improved on. And finally, I will support you in creating a personalized plan for moving to a workload approach and maintaining it.

Jayson Davies has been an occupational therapist for over ten years in Southern California. He created the OT Schoolhouse website and podcast in 2017 as a way to support occupational therapists transitioning to or currently working in educational systems. Jayson believes that OT practitioners have much to offer the students and staff in our schools.
